Party Like It's 1940????

Feature Project

In several days, the Alexandria Jaycees will celebrate their 64th **Annual Charter Night**. This event will be held on **May 15, 2004 from 7:00 PM - 12 am at the Radisson Hotel**, Old Town Alexandria. The dress code for this event is formal (black-tie optional).

This annual event provides an opportunity for Alexandria Jaycees and their guests to enjoy dinner, awards presentation (including the Alexandria Life Member Award), and a dance. As I began to write this article, I decided to conduct some research on my own related to historical events of 1940. Of course, the most important one was Franklin P. Backus becoming the first Alexandria Jaycees President in 1940-41. Here's a quick timeline of other historical facts:

- January 1940- New Radio Shows in 1940: *Abbott & Costello* (NBC); *The Adventures of Superman* (Mutual Radio); *Crime Doctor* (CBS); *Double or Nothing* (Mutual Radio); Gene Autry's *Melody Ranch* (CBS); *Take It or Leave It* (CBS)
- February 1940- Rebecca wins the 1940 Best Picture award at the February 1941 Academy Awards.
- April 1940- Germany invades Norway and Denmark.
- May 1940- Pulitzer Prizes for Letters & Drama: NOVEL— *The Grapes of Wrath* by

John Steinbeck (Viking); BIOGRAPHY— *Woodrow Wilson, Life and Letters, Vols. VII and VIII*, by Ray Stannard Baker (Doubleday); HISTORY— *Abraham Lincoln: The War Years*, by Carl Sandburg (Harcourt); POETRY— *Collected Poems*, by Mark Van Doren (Holt); DRAMA— *The Time of Your Life*, by William Saroyan

- June 1940- Italy declares war on France and Britain.
- August 1940- US Census of 1940 states US population as 131,669,275 (an increase of 8,894,229 over the 1930 census). Compared to 293,052,457 in 2004.
- September 1940- The 40-hour work week, a provision of the Wages and Hours Act (1938) goes into effect as scheduled.
- October 1940- John Winston Lennon born in Liverpool, 9 October.
- December 1940- Major General William N. Haskell forbids the showing of the motion picture *Of Mice and Men*, based on Steinbeck's book, in two Army posts theaters at Fort McClellan, Alabama, as inappropriate for Christmas Eve. Chaplains call the film morbid and degenerate.

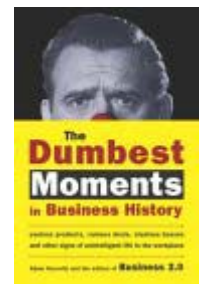

Disaster Readiness Training Available
