## 65 Years of the Alexandria Jaycees: Part 4

With the wild success of Donald Trump's reality television show *The Apprentice*, it is only appropriate that the topic of this month's 65th Anniversary column is MONEY.



As you may know, today's members pay annual dues as well as project-specific costs like trips, entrance fees, party supplies, etc. Many of us also participate in chapter fundraisers by selling concessions at our yardsales, selling tickets at the Scottish Games, serving food at the MCI Center, and so on. Since money makes the world go 'round, here are some interesting yet little-known facts about money and the Alexandria Jaycees:

**\$** In 1940, the chapter's first Charter Night was set at a cost of \$1.50 per person. This amount was increased to \$2 per person a year later, resulting in a \$3.25 profit for the chapter.

**\$** The chapter's first fundraiser was a Boat Club dance. The \$41 profit netted from the dance allowed the chapter to build a playground for the City.

**\$** In 1943, the chapter paid dues for 72 members: \$18.50 for national dues (that's almost 26 cents each!) and \$14.40 for state dues (that's 20 cents each!).

**\$** The cost to attend the Virginia State Jaycee Convention in 1944 was \$7.50 per person, which included all events, a reception Friday night, lunch, a banquet and dance Saturday, and brunch Sunday. "There will be an additional charge for dates at the banquet and dance, but bring her - she's worth it!" proclaimed the chapter in its newsletter, *The Jaycee Bulletin*. (Remember: Jaycees were all male back then!)

**\$** In 1950, we sold Christmas trees for \$1.00 or \$1.50 per tree.

## Celebrating 65 Years in 2005

**\$** In 1957, a check for \$1,080 was presented to Charles M. Goff, administrator of the Alexandria Hospital, as the first installment of a \$5,400 pledge to the "Father's Waiting Room" of the hospital. Our treasury balance was only \$283.15 in 1959.



**\$** In 1972, our operating budget was \$30,000. The 1973 leadership left office with \$5,000 in the treasury.

**\$** In 1978, dues became a whopping \$90 per year if you ate dinner, and \$30 per year if you did not eat dinner.

**\$** In 1984, members of the chapter appeared as stars in a supermarket commercial as a chapter fundraiser.

**\$** In 1989, the chapter's Haunted House raised a record \$16,000.

**\$** In 1996, a yard sale fundraiser that a member's Dad thought up way back in the early 1970s (as a fundraiser for her elementary school) became the chapter's newest and most successful fundraiser, bringing in as much as \$1,500 per event.

**\$** In 2003, the chapter began a new fundraising venture, operating a concession stand at the MCI Center in Washington, DC. This project allows us to collect a portion of the proceeds from the concession stand while seeing some of the events for free!

Now it's your turn to get involved in the chapter's finances! Flip burgers at the next yard sale or help sell programs at the Scottish Games coming up in July. You'll be part of a long and "rich" fundraising legacy!

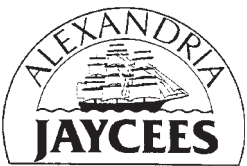
## What Else Happened in 1940?
