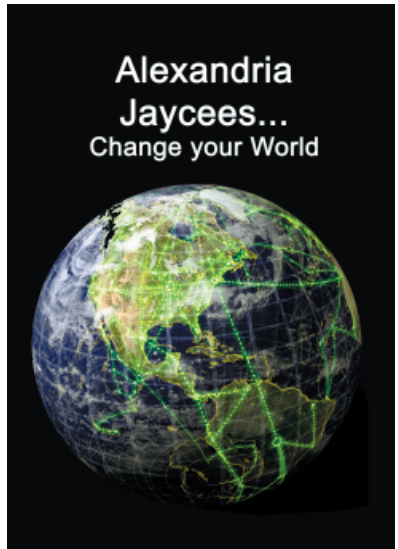

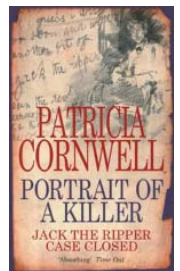

As a City Councilmember, Alexandria Jaycee **Rob Krupicka** has a different perspective than many of us do about community service, one of the core values of Jaycees here and abroad. Here are his replies to questions about volunteerism and "brain drain" of our generation - Gen X and Y - in our community.

Brain Drain & Generation X

"Nationally, retiring baby boomers outnumber the Gen-X crowd nearly two-to-one, which will cause a significant workforce shortage in the next couple decades. Brain drain – the slow leak of talented and educated people from U.S. cities – now affects nearly every U.S. city. *Do you see this phenomenon impacting Alexandria? If so, how?"*

Rob Krupicka: Alexandria has the type of urban amenities and vibrancy that attract the Gen-X crowd. Interestingly, the same amenities attract retirees. Both are looking for diverse, interesting, vibrant places where you can walk, recreate and work.

The large number of small- and medium-sized businesses, proximity to metro and Washington D.C., good schools and unique history put Alexandria in a good position. We can do more. The Landmark Mall redevelopment, Braddock Road redevelopment, the development plans for a town center in Potomac Yards and the recently adopted King Street and Mt. Vernon plans all have vibrancy as one of their goals.

"Urbanists like Richard Florida and Rebecca Ryan believe that what young professionals want to know is how "cool" cities are, such as how many Starbucks there are and if there are farmers' markets nearby, while economists like Joel Kotkin believe that affordability, especially in terms of housing, plays just as big a role in retaining young talent. *What do you think Alexandria's greatest strengths are in retaining young talent? Its weaknesses?"*

RK: Alexandria's combination of old and new, its waterfront, its redeveloping Eisenhower East, Braddock Road areas and its range of housing types from rental to condos to single family give us a lot to be proud of.

We do have coffee shops, eclectic, unique stores, interesting restaurants, and some great parks and open spaces. I think we need a better internal mass transit system so it is easier to live here without a car.

We need a strong pedestrian and bicycle infrastructure so it is safer and more convenient to walk through the City. We need more opportunities for shopping and dining so we can compete with Pentagon Row, Clarendon, Shirlington, and other popular regional destinations.

And like every other jurisdiction in our region, we have to work hard to ensure we have a supply of moderately-priced rental and ownership housing.

Volunteerism

“In *Bowling Alone*, author Robert Putnam posits that the act of volunteering can build society’s capacity to handle social or other issues in two ways: by creating bonding capital or bridging capital.

Bonding: Participating in an organization of like-minded individuals.

Bridging: Groups working on large-scale and civically important initiatives, reaching out to those who are unlike themselves: poor, terminally ill, the elderly, disadvantaged, or homeless, etc.

The Jaycees offer many opportunities for building both bonding and bridging capital in the community – and by building social bonds we can mobilize even more Gen-X and Gen-Y talent in the community, for instance, having a dozen rather than five volunteers helping raise money to combat homelessness at the Carpenter’s Cookoff, or by inspiring new leaders to emerge and head up other projects that benefit the community. *How can Jaycees connect even more to the Alexandria community at large, or how can we ensure we work on important community issues?”*

RK: I think the Jaycees could form a partnership with the Alexandria Volunteer Bureau, which would put them in direct contact with every non-profit looking for volunteers in Alexandria.

“Where do you think the greatest opportunity is for Jaycees to make a difference in the lives of other Alexandrians?”

RK: Tutoring in our schools and working with kids can have an enormous impact on Alexandria’s long term success. Good schools are the answer to many of the complex issues facing urban

areas. It would be great if the Jaycees could also help us raise the funds we need to complete the “Be Ready” emergency preparedness campaign.

I also think that Jaycees can have a real impact by starting businesses in Alexandria and making our City their long-time home.

“How can Jaycees become more engaged in building the community’s strengths to address core issues?”

RK: I’d like to see more Jaycees applying for City boards and commissions. We are always looking for talented people. There are also a number of community planning projects that would benefit from the participation of Jaycees.

It is important that young professionals be represented in these efforts so we define a future that has a home for them.

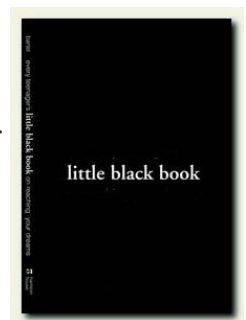
WANTED: Past Jaycees
