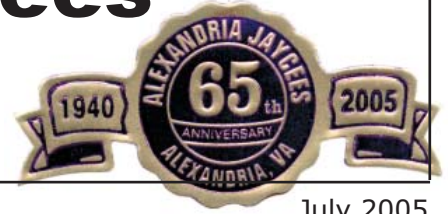

No experience is necessary, but I am looking for people that have sailed in the past to be boat captains. After we dock, we might go to a local restaurant in Old Town or dinner.

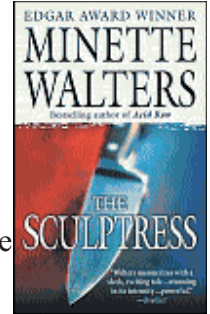

65 Years of the Alexandria Jaycees: Part 5

This month's 65th anniversary column is dedicated to the influence the Alexandria Jaycees have had on the membership of the Virginia Jaycees. Historically, we have always been one of the largest and strongest chapters in the state and have shown that strength by starting many other chapters in the nearby vicinity.

Starting a new Jaycee chapter – otherwise known as “extending” a chapter – involves much time and dedication, including contacting businesses in the target area, getting the word out through flyers and other forms of communication, holding prospective member open houses, signing people up, and coaching the new officers on their roles and responsibilities as Jaycees.

All this would be difficult enough in your own hometown, but is especially difficult when you have to drive somewhere else and extend a chapter in a location you are not completely familiar with!

According to the Alexandria Jaycees' history book (soon to be updated with the 65th anniversary edition), the Alexandria Jaycees are responsible for

extending the following Jaycee chapters throughout our history (Note: This list may be incomplete):



- 1943 – Fairfax extension completed
- 1950 – Warrenton extension completed
- 1951-52 – Harrisonburg Jaycees chartered
- 1981-82 – Alexandria Jaycee Women's Chapter chartered
- 1987-88 – Woodbridge and Franconia chapters extended
- 1994 – Fairfax extension completed (again)
- 2002 – Vienna extension completed

As you can see, chapters come and go, but the Alexandria Jaycees are always there to spread the word about the good things Jaycees accomplish in the state of Virginia and all across the world.

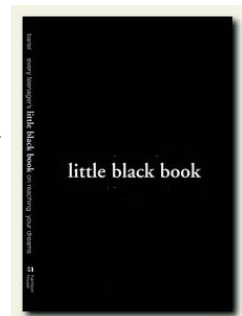

Fort Hunt Park is 5 miles south of Old Town Alexandria; exit to the right at the sign marked “Fort Hunt Road/Fort Hunt Park”. If you need further directions, please use a map and do not contact me because I just may accidentally tell you to go the wrong way on a one-way street!

The cost for the picnic will be \$5 per person. This will provide you a choice of hamburger or Nathan's (not Clafin) hot dogs and choice of drinks from soda and bottled water. If you are planning on attending, it is requested that you bring a side dish or dessert to the picnic, please. Plates, silverware and condiments will be provided.

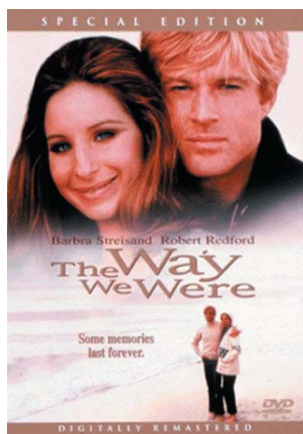
