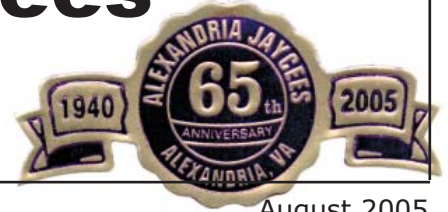

Camp Virginia Jaycee is a year-round residential outdoor recreation and educational facility for children and adults with mental retardation. The Camp, a 501(c)(3) institution, is located in the heart of the Blue Ridge Mountains on 90 acres of fields, forests and streams in Bedford County, Virginia.

Providing new and exciting outdoor experiences, the programs at Camp Virginia Jaycee give these special adults and children the opportunity to make new friends and socialize; overcome personal challenges and learn new skills; and have lots of down-to-earth fun! Program areas include art, music, horseback riding, sports & games, swimming, and nature. Although the major emphasis is on recreation and enjoyment, self-help skills are taught and encouraged in all program areas.

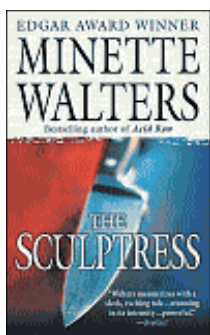

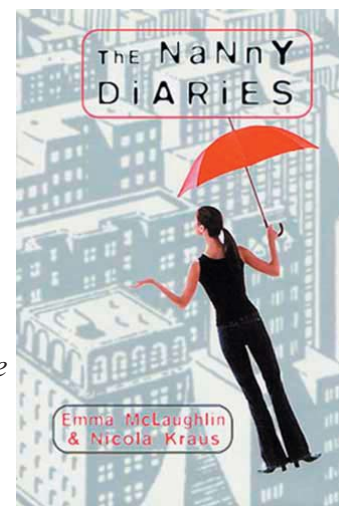

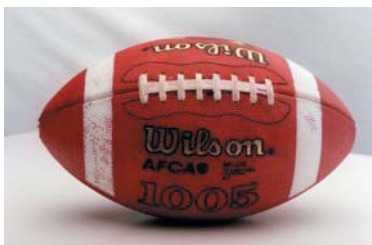

Fort Hunt Park is 5 miles south of Old Town Alexandria; exit to the right at the sign marked “Fort Hunt Road/Fort Hunt Park”. If you need further directions, please use a map and do not contact me because I just may accidentally tell you to go the wrong way on a one-way street!



The cost for the picnic will be \$5 per person. This will provide you a choice of hamburger or Nathan's (not Claflin) hot dogs and choice of drinks from soda and bottled water. If you are planning on attending, it is requested that you bring a side dish or dessert to the picnic, please. Plates, silverware and condiments will be provided.

Tubing Fun Aug. 6

Hey does anyone out there know how to beat the summer heat and humidity? I actually have one way to beat it. No, you don't have to stay indoors with the air conditioning to beat it. The way I am talking about is taking a tubing ride down on the Potomac River. It is a great way to relax while staying cool at the same time. Plus it is a great way to spend a hot summer day. So we are going to go **tubing on Sunday, August 7** on the **Potomac River in Harpers Ferry at 2:30 pm.**

We will be carpooling from Foxchase Shopping Center on Duke Street in Alexandria and we will be leaving exactly at noon. (Any latecomers will be left behind!) The check-in time with the River Riders, the company we are using to go tubing, is an hour before scheduled trip down the river. The tubing will last approximately 2 – 2 ½ hours.

There will be changing areas at River Riders to change into your floating/swimming attire. The rental price of tubes will be either **\$19 or \$26**, but it depends which type of tube you want to float in. Also it is required that tubers wear some type of shoe while tubing.

The directions to River Riders are: to take the Dulles Toll Road West past Leesburg. Exit onto Rt. 9 West to Charles Town. Follow the way to Charles Town. From Rt. 9 West exit onto US 340 North.
