Make a Soldier's Day

It's February, and we're finally out of the wrapping-presents and sending-gift mode... I'd say that we're entirely out of the holiday mood, but I've seen some lights on porches even still, so I won't make that assumption. Regardless, although we've put the season of giving behind us, there are a large number of people who still need to open packages from home – who really need to get that box in the mail.

Imagine that you're serving your country overseas, haven't seen home in a long time, and are in an unfamiliar place helping people who may not be entirely excited that you're in their town. You're out of shampoo... and deodorant? Well... let's just say that you could use more. But more importantly, a little reminder of home, no matter how mundane the contents, is just what you need. To that end, the Alexandria Jaycees have joined the USO to offer assistance in their programs to support our military by packing and sending care packages to military men and women serving overseas.

Several times a month, the USO calls together groups of volunteers to stuff care packages. The care packages are comprised of items specifically requested by service members, such as prepaid international calling cards, disposable cameras, toiletries and sunscreen. They also include personal greetings from the Ameri-

can public that are transcribed onto official "Operation USO Care Package" postcards. "Operation USO Care Package" was approved by the Department of

Defense when heightened security prevented individuals from mailing letters and packages to "Any Service Member." The program has distributed more than 750,000 care packages to service members at USO affiliates worldwide, as well as to deploying troops at U.S. airports and debarkation points since it was launched worldwide in the fall of 2002.

The Jaycees' volunteers are planning to participate in "Operation USO Care Package" in Ft. Belvoir, VA on an every-other-month basis. Did you know the Jaycees are going to **Bermuda October 8-13, 2006?** So keep those New Year's resolutions! You've got a bathing suit to get into! Special activities will be arranged for our group, and you are free to do anything on your own as well!



Here is what is currently available and the applicable prices:

Rooms and Pricing

These rates are per person, and each room **NEEDS** to have two people in it, or you will have to pay double!

Category N - Inside Stateroom-Two twin beds (can convert into queen-size), vanity area and a private bathroom. (146 sq. ft.). \$634.90 (or \$664.90 for non-Jaycees).

Category M - Inside Stateroom-Two twin beds (can convert into queen-size), vanity area and a private bathroom. (146 sq. ft.). These rooms are available on decks 2 and 3. \$644.90 (or \$674.90 for non-Jaycees).

Category I - Outside Stateroom-Two twin beds (can convert into queen-size), sitting area with sofa, vanity area and a private bathroom. (154 sq. ft.). \$774.90 (or \$804.90 for non-Jaycees).

Category F - Outside Stateroom - Two twin beds (can convert into queen-size), sitting area with sofa, vanity area and a private bathroom. (154 sq. ft.) these rooms are on deck 4 only. \$834.90 (or \$864.90 for non-Jaycees).

Category D1- Balcony Stateroom - Two twin beds (can convert into queen-size), private balcony, sitting area with sofa bed, and a private bathroom. (190

sq. ft., balcony 36 sq. ft.). \$974.90 (or \$1,004.90 for non-Jaycees).



Final payment is due 70 days before the sail date—that's also the latest date that you can cancel and get a full re-

fund. Please make all of your payments directly to Cruise Directors, with the exception of your last payment, which should be made payable to the Alexandria Jaycees, who will then make the final payment to Cruise Directors on your behalf (we are subsidizing part of the cost for Jaycee members).

Book your trip now by calling Cruise Directors at (703) 683-6535, and ask for Rachelle. Hours are Monday-Friday 10 a.m. - 6 p.m. Let her know what room category you are interested in, and that you are part of the Alexandria Jaycees group (whether you are a Jaycee or not!!).

All of these rates and cabins are subject to availability, so the sooner you book, the better off you are. \$100 deposit holds your space on this cruise.

Networking Tip: Business Cards

If you are networking for a new job or career, there is nothing inappropriate about having a business card with a tag line of what type of job or company you are seeking.

An outfit with two pockets is important for the business card shuffle - think of those pockets as your in-box and out-box.

Don't ask for a card until you know something about the person's functionality and there is a match. No match, no card.

When you receive someone's card; receive it gently with both hands, stop and read it. This shows respect. Respect to who they are and what they do.

The next game that we are scheduled to work at is Saturday, **February 11 at a hockey game** that features two phenomenal rookies (Alex Ovechkin and Sidney Crosby). Or in case you don't follow hockey, it is the Caps vs. Penguins.



The game starts at 7:00 p.m. so we need to be there at 4:45 pm to set-up the stand. I will

need to know by NOON, Wednesday, February 8 if you will want to work the Caps game on February 11. ***This is the only scheduled concession stand for February*** so please consider working at the stand. We need to have a minimum of four, TIPS trained people to work the stand. If we are unable to get at least four people to work, we will have to cancel the stand like we did for the January 21st stand.



We are also scheduled to work following events in March and April:

- Thursday, **March 16** is the **Billy Joel** concert,
- Friday, **March 24** and Sunday, **March 26** **NCAA Tournament Regionals**,
- Saturday, **April 8** **Miami Heat vs. the Wizards**, and
- Sunday, **April 16** **Cleveland Cavs. vs. the Wizards**.

Why should you consider helping out at the MCI Center Concession Stand? One good reason is that you get into the event for free. You won't be able to see

the event because we will be busy working at the stand, but we will be able to hear the concert and games.



Also you will be helping making the Chapter earn operating funds. At one concert we could possibly bring in \$800-\$1,200. Plus we will be able to eat the food and drink (non-alcoholic beverages) for free as well.

Procedures:

- Meet the group at the scheduled time by the security entrance on 6th Street
- Recommended: comfortable shoes (tennis shoes)
- Required: black slacks or black jeans
- Required: TIPS (alcohol awareness) training
- Required: photo ID

Be sure to bring your picture ID because the security will match it to the list of names that are submitted to the MCI Center. If you don't bring your ID, you will NOT be allowed inside to work.

There are a couple of ways of getting TIPS trained.

1. www.gettips.com. It costs \$40 per person to take the class and the class is accepted by MCI Center.
 2. The TIPS class that I am trying to arrange to be held some time during the first week of March.
- Please watch for further information on the class on the website, list-serve and Chapter Meetings. Just remember by taking this TIPS class, you will be helping out the Chapter. You will be qualified as TIPS trained for 3 years, the class is easy, and you will be certified to work at the Red Cross Waterfront Festival in the summer as well.
