## Relay for Life

The Alexandria Jaycees will be teaming up with the Fairfax Jaycees to participate in the Fairfax Relay for Life. The Relay for Life takes place **June 10-11 at the George Mason University track.**

For those who don't know, Relay for Life is run by the American Cancer Society. It will start Saturday afternoon June 10th and end Sunday morning.

During that time the object is to make sure one member of your team is on the track walking at all times with your team baton. The team baton is one the team makes using a ruler given to them by the Relay organizers. The object is to decorate the baton. The team with the best decorated baton will win an award.

While walking the track is a large part of the event it isn't the only part. On Saturday Evening there will be a luminaria ceremony. Luminarias are candles people can purchase in memory of someone lost to cancer or in honor of someone who survived. During the ceremony all the luminaries are placed so they ring the track. The candles are then lit and the lights on the track are turned off. There are also candles in the stands that are lit and spell out the word "Hope".

Once the lights are turned off the teams captains pass out a candle to each team member and then light them all. After that all the Relay participants will do a lap around the track. If you have never experienced the ceremony, it is quite moving.

Along with the luminaria ceremony the Relay organizers will have games teams can participate in, bands playing on the stage and other events to occupy participants when they aren't on the track. Each team is also allotted a campsite next to the track for folks to eat and get rest when they aren't walking. Tents, chairs, tables etc. can be set up.

Campsites can also be decorated with a theme. The best decorated campsite will win an award. For the

event our team name is "Angels of Hope". Teams can be up to 15 people. I have set a team goal of raising \$2,000 in donations for the American Cancer Society. Last year we raised over \$1,000.

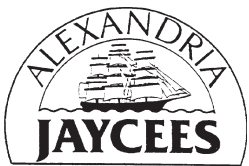
